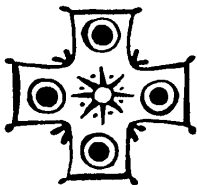

The Year of St. Paul 2008-2009 - Athens, The Idols

In the capital of Hellenism, where one would come to study from all over the Roman Empire, Paul encountered the Greek culture, "exasperated at the sight of the city full of idols" (Acts 17:16). He preached both in the Synagogue and in the public square—even at the Aeropagus—thus provoking the curiosity of intellectuals, "Epicurean and Stoic philosophers", but few of them adhered to the Christian faith. "I even discovered an altar inscribed, 'To an Unknown God'. What therefore you unknowingly worship. I proclaim to you" (Acts 17:23). (Paul never mentioned this episode. This kind of speech recalls rather the preaching of the first missionaries in the Hellenic churches at the end of the first century to some pagans influenced by Stoicism. The absence of any hints to the Cross and salvation causes one to doubt that Paul ever said these words).

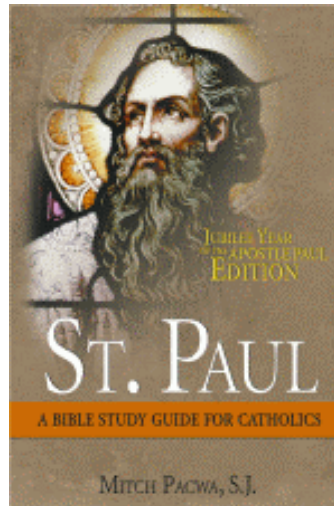

WEEKLY APOLOGETICS

How do we know that the Catholic Church is the one that Jesus founded?

One way we can know is simply by looking at the history. The Catholic Church is the only church that can trace its origin directly and uninterruptedly back to Jesus. All other Christian denominations were founded by men at distinct points in history - e.g., the Lutheran church was founded by Martin Luther in 1517, the Anglican church by King Henry VIII in 1534, the Reformed church by John Calvin in 1536, etc. Only the Catholic Church has an uninterrupted line of bishops that stretches back directly to the apostles.

In addition to the historical record, we can also look at some essential aspects that the Church founded by Christ should have - traditionally known as the four "marks" of the Church. We affirm these marks each time we say the Creed at Mass. Briefly, the true Church of Christ must be:

1. *One* - This means that the Church is unique (i.e., there is only one Church founded by Jesus) and united in one faith. In the gospel of John, Jesus prayed that the apostles would be "one" - united- just as He and the Father are "one" (Jn 10:30). Division and dissension in the Church are always contrary to the will of Jesus, but both frequently occur as the result of our sinful nature (CCC 814). It is the responsibility of all Christians, but especially the pope and bishops, to promote unity among followers of Christ (CCC 879).
2. *Holy* - Simply speaking, the Church is holy because its founder, Jesus, is holy. As a result, we can say that the Church is holy in its beliefs, worship, sacraments, government, and members (especially in the saints). In spite of human weakness, the Church's holiness flows from the very holiness of God Himself.
3. *Catholic* - From the Greek word meaning "universal," the Church's faith extends to the entire world. The Church is not limited to one language, race, culture, or nation - it is intended for everyone, of every place and time.
4. *Apostolic* - Before His ascension, Jesus told His apostles to "Go, and make disciples of all nations...And behold I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Mt 28:19-29). With these words, Jesus gave the apostles "the great commission" to preach the Gospel to the whole world, a mission that will continue after their deaths. As the book of Acts tells us: "...they designated such men and then made the ruling that likewise on their death other proven men should take over the ministry" (CCC 861; CCC 860 and Acts 20:28). In the original Greek of the New Testament, these men were known as the *episkopoi* (meaning "overseers") from which we get the English word "bishop." Today's bishops are descendants of the apostles; they are our modern-day apostles.

These four marks - *one, holy, catholic* and *apostolic* - are found only in the Catholic Church. Although many elements of truth are found outside the Church in other faiths, "in [the Catholic Church] subsists the fullness of the means of salvation which [Jesus himself] has willed" (CCC 830).

School Zone

Obviously, the first grade is a time for many first experiences as a student at St. Mary's School. The two first grade classrooms have each conducted their first Prayer Services. Another new activity for the students is “BOTW”, which also continues on in second grade. BOTW stands for “Breaking Open the Word.” It is designed to help the students become more familiar with the Sunday Gospel that they will hear at Mass in the coming weekend. Our goal is to help the students better understand the Gospel, and to recognize the passage as it is read at the weekend liturgy. This activity consists of several components. First, the teacher reads the upcoming Gospel passage to the children. They discuss the story and its meaning, and what lesson can be learned from it. One phrase in the passage is designated as the “zinger.” This is the phrase that will help the students to remember the meaning of the passage. This zinger will be displayed in the classroom. Each week the students also make a small craft item or do a coloring page that relates to the passage. The zinger and the Gospel Bible reference is also written on this item. The students take home the craft item. Hopefully the students display it somewhere at home so the whole family can be aware of the Gospel reading. To help display the craft item or paper at home, each student made a clothespin magnet to hold the item. The magnet has a picture of the Bible with the letters BOTW written on it. The students also learn the names of the four Gospel writers, and the appropriate responses before and after the Gospel is read at mass. The class talks about the liturgical seasons of the church year, and the colors associated with those seasons, such as green for “Ordinary Time.” The students enjoy BOTW time, especially making the craft item and taking it home to share with their families.

Last week, the Gospel reading was for the “Exaltation of the Holy Cross.” Our zinger was “For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son.” The students glued small hearts, punched from a variety of colored paper, in the shape of a cross. This was done on a larger heart shape on which the Bible reference and the zinger were printed. The students were very creative in their color choices for their crosses, and the hearts and cross reminded us all of God's great love for us.

Stewardship/What is meant by giving of one's time, talent, and material possessions?

Our time, our talents, and our material possessions constitute just some of the treasures we have been given by our very generous God. Sharing these gifts involves being with God in prayer and worship, using our gifts to help build God's Kingdom among our family and friends, our workplace, and our communities and parishes. It means becoming ministers of the Gospel in our communities and parishes in new (and perhaps not-so-new) ways!
